OUR LEARNING DEFINITION

Learning is a continuous process that integrates knowledge, skills and understanding with the real-world application of this process, allowing us to act with integrity in an interdependent world.

TH School Academic Programme

The TH School curriculum has been developed to align with founder Madame Thái Hương's vision of delivering a holistic English medium international programme incorporating essential elements of Vietnamese language, literature, history, and geography. The KG/Primary curriculum incorporates the International Early Years Curriculum (IEYC) and the International Primary Years Curriculum (IPC) alongside the TH School bespoke Vietnamese curriculum. KG/Primary students spend 80% of the school day studying the TH School international curriculum (IEYC and IPC) taught in English by expatriate teachers and 20% of the school day studying the TH School Vietnamese curriculum taught by host national teachers in Vietnamese with the goal of complete bilingualism. Regardless of curriculum students are encouraged to enquire and think critically in their subjects and develop their independent study skills.

INTERNATIONAL EARLY YEARS CURRICULUM (IEYC) FOR 2 TO 5-YEAR-OLDS

In our Kindergarten (KG), we believe our children learn best through play and interacting directly with their learning environment. This provokes curiosity in the world around them and stimulates them to think for themselves, solve problems, work with others to gain an increasing understanding of the world and how it works and their place within this world.

Children start in Kindergarten when they turn 2 years old. In KG, children will learn in both English and Vietnamese. There is roughly 80/20 split. All classes have an international Teacher and a Vietnamese Teaching Assistant, and with class sizes of 15 or less this provides high levels of care and attention to all our children.



TH School follows the <u>International Early Years Curriculum (IEYC)</u>, which is developed by Fieldwork Education and designed around eight learning principles that are considered essential to children's learning and development.

- 1. The earliest years of life are important in their own right.
- 2. Children should be supported to learn and develop at their own unique pace.
- 3. Play is an essential aspect of all children's learning and development.
- 4. Learning happens when developmentally-appropriate, teacher-scaffolded and child-initiated experiences harness children's natural curiosity in an enabling environment.
- 5. Independent and interdependent learning experiences create a context for personal development and are the foundation of international mindedness.
- 6. Knowledge and skills development lead to an increasing sense of understanding when children are provided with opportunities to explore and express their ideas in multiple ways.
- 7. Ongoing assessment, in the form of evaluation and reflection, is effective when it involves a learning-link with home.
- 8. Learning should be motivating, engaging and fun, opening up a world of wonder for children where personal interests can flourish.

INTERNATIONAL PRIMARY CURRICULUM (IPC) FOR 6 TO 11-YEAR-OLDS

Our <u>International Primary Curriculum</u> ensures rigorous learning through exciting and globally relevant themes. It uses the latest research into how children learn best, and we tailor learning experiences so that students can deepen their understanding of their own culture and identity, whilst also developing an increasingly international perspective. The IPC provides children with subject goals, personal learning goals, and uniquely, international learning goals.

Subject goals: Subject goals cover the knowledge, skills and understanding of children relating to the subjects they are learning. There are subject learning goals for:

- Language
- Arts
- Mathematics
- Science
- ICT & Computing, Technology
- History, Geography
- Music, Physical Education, Art and Society





Personal Goals

Students will be taught in such a way that they develop the personal qualities of:

- Cooperation
- Communication
- Resilience
- Respect
- Adaptability
- Morality
 (choosing to do the right thing)
- Enquiry
- Thoughtfulness

International Learning Goals

International learning goals are unique to our curriculum and help young children begin the move towards an increasingly sophisticated national, international and intercultural perspective. Each thematic IPC unit includes an international aspect, to help develop a sense of 'international mindedness.'

Mascot

Thaddeus, named by the children, is the manifestation of all the personal goals. The turtle is important in Vietnamese mythology and the following story outlines its significance.

Stories of the Hoàn Kiếm turtle began in the fifteenth century with <u>Lê Lơi</u>, who became an emperor of <u>Vietnam</u> and founder of the <u>Lê</u> <u>Dynasty</u>. According to legend, Lê Lợi had the sword named <u>Heaven's Will</u> given to him by the Golden Turtle God, <u>Kim Qui</u>.



One day, not long after the war and the Chinese had accepted Vietnam's independence, Lê Lợi was out boating on the lake. Suddenly the Golden Turtle God surfaced, prompting Lê Lợi to return Heaven's Will and thank the divine turtle for its help. The Golden Turtle God took back the sword and disappeared into depths of the lake. Lê Lợi then renamed the lake <u>Hoàn Kiếm Lake</u>, meaning "The Lake of the Returned Sword" (Wikipedia).

Co-Curricular Activities (CCAs)

At TH School, co-curricular activities are integral to our holistic approach to education and life-long learning. They provide a wealth of opportunities to extend learning beyond the classroom and for our students to develop their own passions and skill sets.

We split the year into 3 rotations for our CCAs and you will be invited to sign up for your child's club a week before the start of each rotation.

Co-Curricular Activities: 15:15 - 16:00.



Student Day Trips & Residential Trips

As part of the KG/Primary educational programme TH School organizes off campus trips to reinforce and enhance learning. The opportunity for students to participate in school funded trips provides unique learning experiences. KG/Primary students participate in well planned day trips. Day trips focus on environmental, historical or cultural sites within Hanoi and are conducted during school hours. In addition, Grade 4 and 5 participate multi day residential trips to select locations in throughout Vietnam. Residential trips link classroom learning to "real world" applications. Field trips expand upon the learning outcomes for students by providing "hands-on" experiences in safe and secure learning environments.

Parents will be notified in advance regarding the plan of the trips, agenda, venue and any preparation needed.

Campus Regulations Security at Arrival & Leaving Campus

TH School is a closed campus. Visitors must report to the main security gate with ID in order to receive a Visitor's Pass. Parents are expected to show school ID card at the gate when entering the campus. Other visitors are expected to wear School badges at all times when on the campus.

During the school hours, students are not allowed to leave school without parental and Principal's permissions.





TH School ID Card

The TH School ID card is issued to:

- Identify the card holder as a current member of the TH School community.
- Allow access to school facilities to the extent of the card holders eligibility.

Student Cards

All registered students shall be issued a student card for the duration of their tenure at TH School. Homeroom teachers keep KG/Primary ID cards in a safe place to be used when necessary, eg. when checking out books from library or for use as ID cards on school trips.

Parent Cards

All registered parents shall be issued parent cards. Cards will be shown at the gate when entering the campus. Parents may be asked to show their cards when picking up their child(ren) at the class or other pick up points. Note: there will be no lanyards for wearing, parents can keep the card in their wallet.

Parents will use the TH School card to borrow books from the library and enjoy discounts when purchasing goods/services from campus kiosks.

Child Pick-Up Cards

Designated pick up persons will be issued a "Pick-Up" card. Parents must register specific "pick-up" designees with the TH Admissions Team.

Card Issuance

The TH Admissions Office will issue ID cards.

Card Maintenance

All cardholders are responsible for keeping the card safe and in good working condition. Hole punching, bending, folding, or any other damage to the card, losing the card by negligence, accident, or theft will result in the cardholder being required to pay the replacement fee for a new card. If the card is not functioning properly due to the printing error, a replacement card will be issued at no charge.

Lost or stolen TH School ID cards must be reported to the TH Admissions Office to protect data and school access.

TH School will provide a replacement card for a fee of **VND 50,000**. Replacement of cards will take 10 working days.

Cancellation and Deactivation of ID Cards

ID cards are the property of TH School. ID cards must be returned and cancelled when a student (parent) no longer attends TH School. ID cards will be valid for 4 years from the date of issue. After this period, a replacement card will be provided free of charge.

Supervision

All TH Students in KG and Primary must be supervised at all time on the campus. At the end of the school day (15:00) or at the end of the CCAs (16:15) students are expected to leave the campus. Our outdoor learning/play areas such as the KG playground and the basketball courts are not to be used unless supervised by a number of TH School staff.

Students' Belongings

Please take time to label all of your child's belongings.

TH School takes reasonable precautions to ensure general security of property within the school buildings. However, students should not bring valuable personal belongings, money, toys, food, or items of sentimental value to School. Please also remove jewelry from children. For personal safety, necklaces, bracelets, and other forms of jewelry should not be brought into school. TH School is not responsible for replacing lost, misplaced, stolen, or damaged belongings and valuables.

Prohibitions

TH School is a no smoking campus. Therefore, smoking is not allowed on the campus at any time. In addition, the following are not allowed on campus for health and safety reasons:

- Dogs or any other pets, except service animals
- Weapons of any kind (real or imitation) this includes toy guns
- Explosives
- Food orders and deliveries from external vendors except for approved celebrations such as birthday

Students are not permitted to use or be involved with the use or distribution of alcohol, tobacco, or drugs at any school-sponsored activities both on or off campus. The use, possession or distribution of drugs is strictly prohibited and illegal. Violation of this regulation will result in expulsion.

What to Wear

At TH School we encourage our students to take responsibility for their learning and their behaviour. Students are provided with uniforms and we strongly encourage, but not make daily use compulsory.

When involved in field trips or sporting events students should dress appropriately for the activity.

For formal school ceremonies, school uniform or formal national dress code will be required for attendance.

Examples of formal ceremonies include: Opening Day celebration, International Day, etc.







Air Quality & Sun Safe Policy

The school monitors outdoor air quality (AQI) each morning and follows <u>the protocol outlined HERE</u>.

We are also a sun safe school. Students are required to wear brimmed hats when learning and playing outside all year round. Please label these with your child's name.

Absences or Late Arrival & Early Leaving

Absences or Late Arrival

Parents must phone the KG/Primary School Office at +84 (0)2473092255 – ext. 232 before 08:00 to inform the school of their child's absence or late arrival.

Absences which have not been notified are then checked with the teacher by the School Secretary.

Parents of children with unexplained absences are phoned by the School Secretary to determine the whereabouts of the child. For planned absences, you will need to inform the Principal using <u>this document</u>. We would urge parents to use the school holidays for family travels. Everyday your child is not in school will affect their learning.

All absences appear on student's record. In the event that a student and/or family choose to be on a planned absence, the school will not set up extra work.

Early Leaving

TH School is a closed campus. As such students may not leave the campus without parental and administrative permission. If a child needs to leave campus before the end of the school day, parents must contact the KG/Primary School Office and let them know when the child will be collected and by whom. Please report to the Primary/KG secretary who will assist in collecting the child.



Student Behaviour: Make the Right Choice

The IPC/IEYC have eight personal goals which are used as a guide to the behaviours we wish to see develop across the school. One of these goals is morality, which we translate into "making the right choices". Our approach to behaviour has been built on this principle.

TH School is a friendly and caring place where students are free and safe to learn and play. All our behaviour standards are based on ensuring that the students act in a safe, sensible and caring manner and that they take responsibility for their own behaviour and the choices they make.

This is emphasised and underpinned by a positive attitude to their own and others' learning and well-being. Students are taught to respect each and every person regardless of age, nationality or gender. The school does not tolerate bullying or racism of any description. All incidents relating to bullying or racist behaviour are referred immediately to the Principal.

If students do not conform to our personal goals, there are various class strategies teachers can employ as part of their day to day management of the class. If a child persistently chooses not to follow the personal goals, teachers will discuss this with the Primary/KG Coordinator and work together to support the child to make the right choices. Parents will be informed at this stage, if they have not been informed before. If there is no improvement, the Primary/KG Principal will become involved and will speak to the child and parents.

Anti-Bullying Guidelines

TH School is committed to the safety and protection of children and all members of our school community. Every member of TH School community is expected to treat self and each other with respect and dignity. We develop and maintain a whole school approach to prevent and tackle bullying behaviours by adopting key principles drawn from best practices:

- A positive school culture and climate;
- A school-wide approach;
- Implementation of education and prevention strategies (including awareness raising measures);
- Effective supervision and monitoring of students;
- Supports for staff;





- Consistent recording, investigation and follow up of bullying behaviour (including use of established intervention strategies); and
- Ongoing evaluation of the effectiveness of the anti-bullying policy.

The focus of the school shall be placed on prevention by building a positive school culture and climate. However, when a concern is identified, set protocols shall be followed to investigate, communicate with people involved, support victim and restorative justice procedure consequences will be applied to the bully.

Library Library Hours

8:30 - 16:30 Monday to Friday. The library is closed during the school holidays.

Parents can accompany children to the library after school. No children can be kept unsupervised in the library at any times, especially after school.



Library Policy

TH School's library is a place for reading, researching, and learning. Therefore, we expect everyone to keep it clean, quiet and to respect other readers. Consumption of food, drinks is not permitted in the library.

Students can borrow up to 2 books at one time and up to 14 calendar days. When the due date expires, if the borrowers want to continue to borrow the materials, they have to bring the materials to the library to apply for an extension. With respect to rare or valuable books/documents, students must read the materials in the library.

Students are expected to respect the loan periods and return in time so that others can use the resources/books. Lost, or damaged items must be replaced with the exact same items by the borrower, or he/she will be billed with the cost of the item plus shipping and processing.

In the future, the library can be used by the parents as well.



Bus Services

TH School offers a bus service from many districts within Hanoi using convenient pick-up and drop-off points. All buses are equipped with seat belts, and students are required to use them when travelling.

Pick-up: Pick-up locations will be safe, central and close to your place of residence. Parents need to make sure to bring their child on time for the bus pickup.

Drop-off: Parents must collect their child promptly. In case parents cannot pick up their child on time, they will need to inform the bus monitor beforehand and alternative arrangements will need to be made for transportation by parents.

Students should behave in a respectful manner at all times whilst on the bus and follow the instructions set by the bus monitor.

Each bus driver is accompanied by a bus monitor whose responsibility is to ensure that safety procedures are followed and that children are collected and dropped off at correct venues. School keeps parents informed of the contact details of bus driver and monitor of their child's bus. Eating at School

At TH School, students' meals are designed according to Vietnam's Nutritional Pyramid, developed by the country's leading nutritional experts at the TH Nutritional Institute.

Students are provided:

- A wholesome breakfast
- Morning refreshment with fruits, milk and/or yogurt
- A healthy lunch
- Snack during afternoon break for Pre-KG and KG1
- Snack for those attending clubs at 3.15pm



We source our dairy products from <u>TH True Milk</u> and our organic fruits and vegetables from <u>FVF</u>, as well as other trusted vendors. Students are taught and encouraged to develop independence in making nutritional choices.

Medical & Health Care

Student well-being underpins academic success. We pride ourselves on offering not only everyday pastoral care and support for our students but also opportunities for students to develop their physical abilities to stay healthy along with a specially designed nutritional programme.

Sickness

Our Health Office has the ability to manage minor accidents or first symptoms of sickness. Students will be sent home if they develop symptoms such as temperature of 39 or higher, vomiting, diarrhoea, viral or bacterial conjunctivitis, or any illness that preventing them from participating in class or could be infectious.

Student should be kept at home if the above symptoms/sickness have not been fully treated.

Please note that children who have been sick or who have diarrhoea should be kept at home for 24 hours after the last bout of being sick or having diarrhea. This is to stop spreading the illness to other children and teachers. Please support with this.

Step 6: Student returns to school with physician's approval and recommendations (if necessary) for follow up treatment.

*Parents are contacted at the earliest opportunity and are kept updated as appropriate

*If the School is unable to contact a parent the School will contact the child's designated emergency contacts.

*In an emergency situation the School reserves the right to authorize medical treatment if the School is unable to contact the parent or designated emergency contacts.

USE OF MEDICINE

All medicines or any medication supplements are to be kept and distributed by the school nurse. The students are not allowed to self-medicate. Parents should hand over the medicines to the school nurse and request for medicine administration by filling in <u>THIS FORM</u> with clear dose and time.

Parent Guidelines Guardianship

All TH School students must be under the guardianship of a parent or legal guardian at all times. Parents/guardians are responsible for updating the school when there are any changes in contact details and parental/guardian status.

TH School Constructive Communication Policy

Constructive school communication is essential for a healthy school environment. A desire for student success is the number one thing that ties all school community together. Parents need to have clear guidelines as to what communication channels should be pursued when seeking information, raising queries or concerns.

Reports	In December and June, parents will receive an individual report on the attainment and progress made by your son/daughter. This highlights the main learning outcomes relevant for the year group and the progress your child is making towards these.
Scheduled Parent Teacher Meeting Scheduled Parent Teacher	At the start of the academic year parents will be invited to a "Meet the teachers" presentation, where you will get a chance to meet the teachers who will be guiding your child across the year of learning. Parents will hear a presentation about the structure of the day, the topics to be covered and also any specific information about the class.
Meeting	After the first few weeks, parents will have an individual consultation with the class teacher to look at how well your child has settled into the routines and learning within the new class.
	In January, following the written report, parents will be invited to a three-way consultation where your child will share their learning with you, their successes and also areas they will be targeting across the remainder of the year.
	In March, you will be able to drop-in to your child's class to see the fun learning they have been engaged with. Your son/daughter will take the lead with this and take you around school to see their wonderful learning.
	At the end of the academic year there will be an optional meeting with the class teacher to discuss any areas highlighted in the end of year report.
TH School Yearbook	At the end of the academic year a TH Yearbook will be created. This is a wonderful keepsake showing your child in their class with their classmates and teacher. It also summarises the main events across the year.



Raising Queries & Concerns

In order to ensure swift and effective action with concerns or queries, students and parents are encouraged to speak/write directly with the person who can answer or solve the problem. In other words, it should be handled at the level closest to the issue. Parents and students should first discuss any problems with the teacher if appropriate, and then the respective Principal and finally the Superintendent if needed.

Please note that during the school day the teachers are busy teaching and supervising your children so there will be delays in responding to you. For urgent matters, please call the School Office.

TH School Parents Engagement Association for Collaborative Enrichment (PEACE)

PEACE exists as an advisory body to promote communication and collaboration between the Parents and the School with the fundamental aim of enhancing the educational and holistic development of the students. Any decisions and course of action will respect and incorporate the fundamental tenets of the School mission and vision. PEACE is organized and operates as a voluntary support association.

Member of PEACE: All members of the present parents/guardians of present students of TH School are automatically members of the PEACE.

Class Representatives: Class Representatives are nominated at the beginning of each academic year and volunteer to serve as a representative for each class.

Executive Committee: The Executive Committee members are elected by and from the General Committee. The duties of the Executive Committee are to identify, lead and implement, with the support of the PEACE members, activities in pursuit of the objectives set. The Executive Committee also works closely with the School in organizing and volunteering for school activities.

Home Learning Guidelines

We encourage parents to help your children to take charge of their home learnings, and as Dalton Miller-Jones, Ph.D. says "We want them to be responsible for their successes and failures, show them how engaging learning is, and that the motivations for learning should be the child's intrinsic interests, not an external reward."

For students at kindergarten and primary levels, research has found that home daily reading will have the greatest positive impact on academic success. We strongly encourage that daily reading at home in both English and mother tongue.

Parents can also help by creating an environment in which children can engage in many activities that have positive impact on their learning such as time outdoor, physical exercise, family time, games/board games with siblings and/or neighbour friends.

Gift Giving Policy

TH School acknowledges that Vietnam has a beautiful culture of expressing appreciation and gratitude. The School however discourages students and parents buying and giving gifts to school teachers and staff. However, student-made cards, simple handicrafts or flowers are examples of acceptable gifts to express appreciation to teachers for special events such as Teachers' Day and Tết. More substantial gifts are strongly discouraged and will be donated to TH Community Fund. Cash gifts of any amount are prohibited.
